Objective

- Aim to **facilitate take up and reuse** at national/regional level of joint HTA Work and/or HTA work produced by other HTA agencies.
 - Why
- **Reuse** is essential to **demonstrate the usefulness** of EU cooperation
- To enable **long term sustainability** of "Joint Work"
 - "...If the **reuse** is not happening to the desired extent, there is the risk that the EU cooperation remains an interesting exercise but with limited value for national/regional HTA activities..."
